

Abstract

Since Sheikh al-Tusi selected several men from the lost book of al-Kashi, and *Ikhtiyar Ma'rifat al-Rijal* is a collection of al-Tusi's selections from the book of al-Kashi known as *Ma'rifat al-Rijal*, it is crucial to understand the origins and history of the thesis title. The book covered a wide range of subjects and dealt with various Shiite men.

Due to the several significant topics it covered, this book was significant and deserving of study. Its methodology stands out for exposing numerous extremists and their sects and presenting their narratives. We thought it was appropriate to examine al-Tusi's methods and the manner in which he exposed and elucidated the extremists. The definition and language of extremism must be studied, along with its various forms and the Imams of the Prophet's Household's stance on them. As a result, the thesis notion emerged.

In the book *Ikhtiyar Ma'rifat alRijal*, we discovered Sheikh alTusi's interest in exposing the extremists, their sects, and their narratives. At the same time, we were able to learn the methodology that Sheikh al-Tusi employed in order to expose the extremists.

Following the presentation of the narratives, their analysis, and an attempt to arrive at the facts, the analytical approach was employed. The investigation also connected the Quranic verses to their respective surahs. The hadiths were likewise taken from their contemporary sources using this process. as well as the translation of the names and locations that were referenced in the study. The book

"Ikhtiyar Ma'rifat Al-Rijal" also taught us about Sheikh Al-Tusi's strategy and how it exposed the extremists. Though the majority of them remained fanatical in their beliefs, thoughts, and lies, the Ahl al-Bayt (peace be upon them) advocated for raising awareness among the extreme group that still engages in religious and sectarian extremism today.
